DOYLE, MRS, BEATRICE

LOCATION 8-8-41 WHITLOW mj Follow U. S. Highway #64 east from Hayesville for approximately 5 miles to the Elf community, after reaching Earl Crawford's Store, the 4th house on the left is the Doyle home.

HOME

The Doyle home is a unpainted frame shack situated on the side of a hill above the highway with no organized effort to maintain a lawn, however there are several shrubs, a few flowers, and some grass. The interior of the house was not very good, the furnishings being inexpensive and dilapidated; apparently little housekeeping effort is made, all of which contributes to the overall appearance of dilapidation.

FAMILY

The worker was received very gushingly by Mrs. Doyle and children, stating that her husband had been away from home for 3 years, but that this was not the first time he had abandoned her and the children, having been away once for 4 years, and that she does not know of his whereabouts. Mrs. Doyle stated that the general health of the family was good. To the worker, the family appeared intelligent and apparently maintain an average relationship in the community. The worker does not know how this family manages to exist, as keeping the children in school must be difficult.

FARM AND EQUIPMENT

Since this family is a non-farm family, they own no work stock or equipment.

EMPLOYMENT

The source of income of this family is odd jobs in the homes of neighbors which are performed by Mrs. Doyle and children, who also pick berries, gather fruit, and do other small tasks. Additional income is supplied by two members of the family who are in the armed forces of the U. S., but according to Mrs. Doyle's statement, this is not very much. A daughter, who is employed at the Dickey Hotel in Murphy, N. C., also contributes to the family income.

REMOVAL

The attitude of this family toward TVA and removal, as indicated by Mrs. Doyle and children, is one of being willing to cooperate in every way possible, yet they are rather frightened at the prospect.

RELOCATION & READJUSTMENT

PROBLEMS:

(1) The removal of those connections which contribute to the income of this family will be difficult to replace in a new location.

(2) The limited resources of this family, together with the small proceeds from the sale of land to the Authority, will make relocation and readjustment very difficult.

RESOURCES:

(1) The proceeds from the sale of land to the Authority will contribute to the resources of this family in relocation and readjustment.

(2) The employment of the daughter, as well as the assistance of the sons, will continue to assist this family in re-

location and readjustment.

(3) The fact that Mrs. Doyle has been able to keep the children in school and keep the family unit in act, indicates that she has ability to meet situations, and this ability will be of value in relocation and readjustment.

NEEDS:

- (1) The family needs the advice and assistance of the Farm Readjustment Office.
- (2) They need the aid and assistance of the Public Welfare Department, if they are not receiving this assistance now.
- (3) They need a relocation in such a vicinity which will provide home employment for Mrs. Doyle.

PLANS

At the time of the interview, no definite relocation plans have been made by this family, and it is the opinion of the worker that this family should be watched very carefully to prevent their developing into a more serious problem.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION 9-26-41 On this date, worker learned that daughter, Rosie, had married Elmer Williamson in June. At the time the family face sheet and record was made, this marriage was not known. A little later, it became known and Rosie was employed as a waitress at the Dickey Hotel. Her husband had an appointment with the Tennessee Valley Authority at the same time. Mr. Williamson expressed a desire to obtain an appointment with the Tennessee Valley Authority recently, since they have returned to the mother-in-law's home at Elf and are living there at present. At this date, worker contacted Representative Prophet, Personnel Department, Chatuge Dam, concerning work for Williamson.
